As a proud member of both the Canada Border Services Agency Partners in Protection (PIP) and the U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Customs Trade Partnership Against Terrorism (CTPAT) program since September 2003, supply chain security continues to be an integral part of our culture and business processes at Day & Ross.

PIP and CTPAT are voluntary government-business sector partnership programs where members work with both customs authorities to strengthen their international supply chains and ultimately improve border security.
